

CREATE A ONE PAGE SINGLE-SPACED ARTIST'S STATEMENT.

This means that you will need to sit down and think about what you personally wanted to achieve for your artwork (choose one piece of work from this year), as well as what kind of message you were trying to communicate to the viewer(s) of your work. Not only does an artist's statement say something about the work (meaning processes/techniques/craftsmanship), but it also should give the viewer many compelling insights about the artist who created the work (meaning emotions/feelings/inspirations/ideas). I will be using your artist statement to further understand your portfolio of work while grading your midterm. Your artist statement is due at the beginning of class on the day of the final. It is **worth 20%** of your final grade. Guidelines:

_____ Title? (What is the work called?)

_____ Medium? (Material it is made out of? pencil, paint, ink, gel medium, pastels)

_____ Dimensions of the work? (in inches)

_____ Explanation of why you chose to represent this piece

_____ Information on your vision, including careful examination of subject

_____ Explanation of where you got your inspiration or ideas from while creating

_____ An explanation of how you incorporated these ideas into your finished work

_____ Use of appropriate and correct terminology pertaining to the work chosen

_____ Explanation of each of the elements and principles of art that pertain to your work:
