Woodside helps students contact a local home-stay agency to arrange for a host family, and advises on arranging a local guardian. Students feel comfortable and supported when they are part of a family while living in San Francisco.

We admit students on a rolling basis until the prospective class is full, so the earlier your application is complete, the sooner we can send you our decision. Woodside provides the I-20 student visa form upon admission to the school.

English Language Development

English language learners will improve their skills with trained ESL teachers in a combination of ESL and immersion classes.

STEM

Students are prepared for college STEM courses by taking AP Calculus AB, AP Physics, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, AP Computer Science, STEM challenge projects, and by participating in Math, Science and Computer Science clubs.



Spotlight on Philosophy

Unique among high schools, Woodside offers 4 years of Philosophy. Because the University of California classifies these as English courses, taking Philosophy particularly helps non-native English speakers to boost their mastery of English language and literature.
